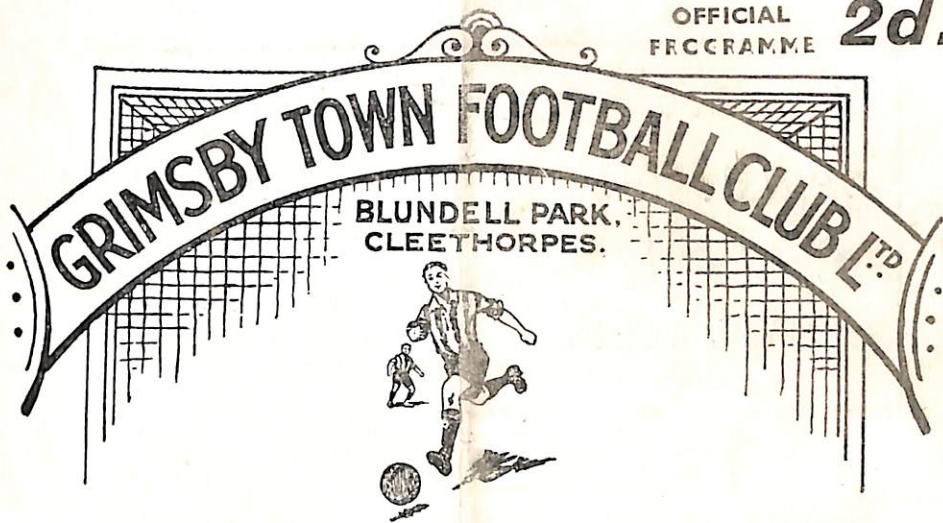

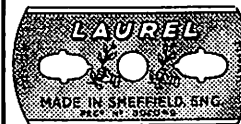

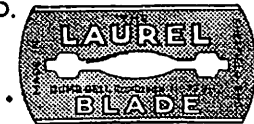

HERE'S THE ANSWER

1—Blackburn Rovers, with Clifford Binns, John Hughes, and James Barron (professionals) and K. J. Hamill and J. Pratt (amateurs) between and including March 14th and April 25th, 1936.

2—Mr. Harold Wightman. He resigned the managership of Luton Town (Southern Section) on October 10th, 1935, became Derby County's (First Division) chief "scout" on November 26th, 1935, was appointed Manager of Mansfield Town (Northern Section) on January 14th, 1936, and of Nottingham Forest (Second Division) on May 2nd, 1936.

3—Torquay United began season 1928-29 with an eleven of which every member had been secured since the previous campaign, and Carlisle United started 1935-36 with a similar side.

4—The late "Jock" Ewart, the Scottish international goalkeeper. He was transferred from Airdrieonians to Bradford City in April, 1912, later returned to the Scottish Club, and left it again for the one in Yorkshire in June, 1927.

5—Donald McKinlay, who was a Liverpool left-back or left half-back from January, 1910, until May, 1929.

6—That created by Plymouth Argyle, who finished in the second position in the Southern Section in each of the six seasons from 1921-22 to 1927-28 inclusive.

HISTORY OF CHELSEA.

Club formed in 1905.

Played on present ground since 1905.

Record attendance :—82,905 *v.* Arsenal (League), October 12th, 1935.

Best in F.A. Cup :—Runners-up in 1914—15.

Biggest Football League victories :—7—0 *v.* Burslem Port Vale, March 3rd, 1906 ; 9—2 *v.* Glossop, September 1st, 1906 ; 7—0 *v.* Lincoln City, October 29th, 1910.

Heaviest defeats :—0—6 *v.* Nottingham Forest, Sept. 21st, 1907 ; 0—6 *v.* Preston North End, September 7th, 1908 ; 0—6 *v.* Notts. County, February 9th, 1924 ; 0—6 *v.* Liverpool, April 20th, 1935.

Most Football League goals for Club up to start of 1939 war : 116 by G. R. Mills, from 1929-30 to 1938-39 inclusive.

Record individual total of Football League goals for one season :—30 by R. Whittingham, in 1910-11.

Best individual scoring feat for one Football League match :— Five goals by G. R. Hilsdon *v.* Glossop, September 1st, 1906.

Best individual scoring feat against for one Football League match :—Five goals by W. R. Dean (Everton), November 14th, 1931.

Total players (while with Club) supplied for International Championship matches :—25 :—12 English, 5 Scottish, 2 Welsh, 6 Irish.

Longest service in Club's employ among present registered professionals :—George Mills, secured in November, 1929.

Total players ordered off in Football League matches since 1914—18 war :—Seven.
