* At the end of season 1893/94 both McCairns and Fletcher had 18 goals apiece with McCairns having overtaken Ackroyd's 17 goals first. However, Fletcher drew level and even surpassed McCairns for a time during 1894/95, both players swapping and sharing the lead with every match until McCairns became the first Grimsby player to score 30 FL goals and left Fletcher behind on Boxing Day 1894.

Both McCairns and Fletcher left Grimsby in 1898 (with 86 and 73 goals respectively), but Fletcher was to have a further two spells with the club and eventually reclaimed the record.
