


Tonight we welcome Luton Town to Blundell Park for our second home League game of the season. The 'Hatters' under new manager Terry Westley, a former coach at Kenilworth Road, are hoping for a better campaign than they had in 1994-95 which saw them finish a rather disappointing 16th in the final First Division table - ten points clear of the relegation zone but 18 points short of a play-off place.

Since the end of last season there have been a few changes at the club. Former boss Pleat moved to Sheffield Wednesday while one or two players also departed, including Paul Telfer to Coventry City and David Preece to Derby County. Luton therefore have had to rebuild, and into the camp have come four useful players: David Oldfield (from Leicester), Gavin Johnson (from Ipswich), Bontcho Guentchev (from Ipswich) and defender Steve Davis (from Burnley), the latter for £500.000.

Still at the club are experienced goalkeepers Fred Barber, now 32 and The American Juergan Sommer (26) plus young 19 year-old 'keeper Kelvin Davis, who is highly rated at Kenilworth Road. In defence Luton can call on the services of David Greene, an Eire U/21 international; Richard Harvey, who agreed a new contract in

the summer; Julian James, a former England U/21 player; Marvin Johnson who has been at the club 10 years; Des Linton, once of Leicester; the veteran Trevor Peake who won an FA Cup winners medal with Coventry in 1987, new man Steve Davis and Mitchell Thomas, ex-Tottenham and West Ham.

To do battle in the midfield, manager Westley can choose from Welsh international Ceri Hughes; the versatile Gavin Johnson; Tony Thorpe, recruited from YTS in 1992; Gary Waddock, ex-Q.P.R. and Bristol Rovers; Scott Oakes, son of the Showaddywaddy star Trevor, who can also play up front; Matt Woolgar, a graduate from the YTS; David Oldfield, in his second spell at the club and Graham Alexander who can also defend if required.


The Hatters' attackers will be chosen from Guentchev, a Bulgarian international; Jamie Woodsford, who made his debut last season; Dwight Marshall, who cost £150,000 from Plymouth; Rob Matthews, secured from Notts County and £200,000 acquistion John Taylor from Bradford City, who hit three goals in nine games at the end of last season. Luton will be a difficult side to beat. They enjoy attacking but defend well. It should be an interesting contest.

The Manager

Terry Westley, the former coach at Kenilworth Road, was appointed team manager of Luton Town (in succession to David Pleat) in July of this year. He had been on the 'Hatters' coaching staff since 1991 and is now the club's 20th manager.

Once a player with Ipswich Town, Terry played non-League football for Bury St. Edmunds and also for Diss Town, being player-manager of the latter.

He returned to Portman Road in 1988 to take over their School of Excellence before Pleat persuaded him to join Luton. Since then he has been responsible for the youth set up at the club and has seen the likes of John Hartson and Kevin Davis progress in the game.







WOLVES HOLD ROVERS

Second placed Tranmere, after being held 2-2 at home by Wolves, found their feet in their next game and won 2-1 at Sheffield United, ace marksman John Aldridge scoring twice.

READING ROAR BACK

Reading drew 1-1 at Stoke and then beat Derby 3-2 at Elm Park where Lee Nogan notched the winning goal 30 seconds from time after the Rams had fought back from two down to equalise.

POTTERS PROGRESS

Stoke City won 3-2 at Leicester (after that draw with Reading) and indeed, they led 3-0 at Filbert Street with Canadian international Paul Peschisolido scoring twice.

UNDER-DOGS HAVE THEIR DAY

Relegated Norwich City were held 0-0 at home by Sunderland after opening their campaign with a 3-1 triumph at Luton, and Alan Buckley's West Bromwich stunned the home fans in the 26,000 plus crowd at Molineux nine days ago by holding favourites Wolves 1-1, Bob Taylor on target for the Baggies, this after former Mariner Dave Gilbert had scored on his debut for Albion in their first-day win over Charlton.



Mariners had beaten both Southend United (4-1) and Notts County (2-1) at home and away and had gained a 1-1 draw at Middlesbrough.







Talk of the Town

Q - If Alan Buckley became England manager would Tony Rees play for England?
A - No...he's Welsh?

Now that that question has hopefully grabbed your attention, today's 'Talk of the Town' is simply about managers and their loyalties to certain players (and not about whether Alan Shearer would read Rees' back heels!).

A manager is someone who gets results from people. In all professions, managers need to have employees who can understand instructions and put them into practice effectively. When a boss moves on, he (or she) often takes their most effective staff with them.

In football it is no different and sometimes players who are more naturally skilful are not picked ahead of players who can carry out the manager's instructions.

Look at the England side of the early 1980s, when the manager was Bobby Robson, he had a few Ipswich players in the team that surprised a number of people at the time.

Although the last two England managers' selections have not been littered with ex-Villa and/or Spurs players, Graham Taylor always got the best out of David Platt, and Darren Anderton has been in fine form under Terry Venables.





Probably the best example of an effective, but not overly skilful or flamboyant, player scaling great heights is John McGovern. In the late '.70s, McGovern helped win the old First Division championship and European Cup with Nottingham Forest.

He was often seen as being Brian Clough's most effective 'foot soldier.'

Another ex-Forest player managed by Cloughie is Brian Laws. Some fans hope he will build a 'North East connection' at Blundell Park.


Certainly the signing of Middlesbrough-born Nicky Southall from Hartlepool and the return to goalscoring form of Steve Livingstone (also born in Middlesbrough) is both ironic and impressive.







AUGUST 29th

1931

Forward Bill Chalmers, Town's new signing from Newcastle, makes his debut v.
Huddersfield Town. Chalmers made only six appearances for the Mariners, though after the war he went on to manage Italian giants, Juventus.

1951

An early 'local derby' brings Lincoln City to Cleethorpes. Jimmy Hernon and recent signing Fred Marlow both find the net over the eventual Third Division North champions, with Town finishing runners-up.

1962

Ron Rafferty, in his last season with Grimsby, scores Town's goal in a 2-1 home defeat by Portsmouth. The Mariners' return to Second Division soccer was proving hard, with this game marking the start of six successive defeats.

1964

An own-goal by defender Des Anderson sets Grimsby on the way to a 2-1 victory over Exeter City. Keith Jobling hits the winner - one of only five League goals during his 16-year Mariners' career.


1970
